30 YEARS OF GOD'S WORD BY GOD'S GRACE

Excitement and expectation welled as we approached the weekend of April 25 – 27 -- a busy weekend, full of joy and blessings, as the Community of St. Dysmas celebrated 30 years of God's Word by God's Grace. Amid the celebrations God's Word was proclaimed and hearts were lifted.

The celebration began with special worship in two of our four sites – MCIW and MCIJ, with the participation of special guests, the first pastor, Ed Nesselhuf and his wife, Diane, and the current Director of Prison Congregations of America (PCA), Mary Mortenson. During these services, Pr. Ed recited his poem, "What Was it Like for You, Dysmas?" and Mary shared God's Word. It was here, in MCIW then MCIJ that this all began thirty years ago.

Then, on Sunday nearly 70 people came to at Calvary Lutheran Church in Mt. Airy where the celebration began with Bishop Richard Graham of the Metro-DC Synod and Assistant to the Bishop Ron Schlack of the DE-MD Synod leading us, and Mary Mortenson preaching in a service of Word and Sacrament. Following the worship, was our dinner celebration and program that included testimonials from former CSD members and special recognition of former pastors. In his keynote address, Pr. Ed spoke of the life and resilience of this ministry.
